Speaking of building character, just a quick reminder that Lent begins next Wednesday, Feb. 17th. Mass will be at 7pm with the distribution of blessed ashes. Please prayerfully consider making Fridays' Mass and Stations of the Cross/Benediction as part of your Lenten observance. Mass will begin at 7pm. Prayer is the first means to save our souls, a powerful help to atone for our sins and draws down God's graces to avoid sin in the future and grow in the virtues. Ash Wednesday is the beginning of the Holy Season of Lent during which we enter liturgically into the desert wilderness with our Lord as He prays, fasts and endures temptation in atonement for our sins. How much suffering we have cost our Beloved Savior! And how few of His disciples really understand and appreciate what our Lord has accomplished for us. ### Lenten Regulations for Catholics

The Lenten season begins February 17th with Ash Wednesday. Here are the regulations and guidelines Catholics are to follow during the season of Lent.

- The Christian faithful are to do penance for their sins through prayer and fasting, abstinence and by exercising works of piety

and charity. All Fridays through the year, especially during Lent, are penitential days.

- **Abstinence:** All who have reached their 14th birthday are to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent.
- **Fasting:** All those who are 18 or older, until their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Only one full meal is allowed on days of fast. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's need; but together, they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.

The obligation does not apply to those whose health or ability to work would be seriously affected. People in doubt about fast or abstinence should consult a priest.

**Do An Activity each day of Lent**

- ⇒ Don't complain about the weather.
- ⇒ Try to understand another's point of view.
- ⇒ Make someone laugh.
- ⇒ Praise someone honestly.
- ⇒ Say, "I'm sorry." Mean it.
- ⇒ Clean up an eyesore in your neighborhood.
- ⇒ Respond the first time someone calls you.
- ⇒ Send a flower to someone from whom you are estranged.
- ⇒ Ask God to do what is best for the public person you dislike most.
- ⇒ Help someone realize his or her self-worth.
- ⇒ Cement a friendship.
- ⇒ Try not to waste anything for one whole day.
- ⇒ Call someone who is lonely.
- ⇒ Help without being asked.
- ⇒ Resist trying to be the center of attention.
- ⇒ Be a shoulder to cry on.
- ⇒ Expand your horizons - go to a lecture, read a book, see a play.
- ⇒ Be patient with others.
- ⇒ Refuse to gossip.
- ⇒ Refuse to whine.
- ⇒ Readily forgive anyone who hurts you.
- ⇒ Surprise yourself.
- ⇒ Make sure your financial investments are socially responsible.
- ⇒ If you love someone, say so.
- ⇒ Advocate on behalf of social issues such as affordable housing.
- ⇒ Thank God for the gift of life.
- ⇒ Pray for a friend.
- ⇒ Pray for an enemy.
- ⇒ Find out what a dollar will buy in Peru or Zambia.
- ⇒ Visit a shut-in.
- ⇒ Give away all your "extras."
- ⇒ Act like a Christian.
- ⇒ Really pay attention to your kids.
- ⇒ Examine your conscience.
- ⇒ Be patient and calm no matter what happens.
- ⇒ Refuse to judge or categorize others.
- ⇒ Be a peacemaker at work or school.
- ⇒ Spend some silent time alone.
- ⇒ Be a sign of hope for someone who is depressed.
- ⇒ Recognize the truth about yourself - no matter how good it is.
